COMMA SPLICES

- A comma splice occurs when you connect two independent clauses with a comma.
 - We don't want to do that.
- Ways to fix a comma splice:
 - Period and a capital letter
 - Comma and a coordinating conjunction (FANBOYS)
 - Semicolon

LITERARY TERMS

- Situational Irony
 - The exact opposite of what you'd expect
 - A swimming instructor drowning
 - A teacher who preaches about how bad smoking is, smoking.
 - A blind man being able to "see" things most clearly
 - Teiresias vs. Oedipus

Allusion

- Reference to a person, event, object, or work from history or literature
- Sphinx
 - We'd have to know that Oedipus defeated the Sphinx by answering the riddle:
 - "What walks on four legs in the morning, two legs in the afternoon, and three legs at night?"

RUN-ON SENTENCES

- Run-on sentence=comma splice (usually)

PUNCTUATION—FRAGMENTS

- Sentence fragments/incomplete sentences
 - When writers break off a part of a complete sentence and let it stand alone
 - Can be corrected by joining the fragments to complete sentences nearby, using commas when necessary
- Fragment: We realized we would not win the game. If we did not score on the next play.
- Correction: We realized we would not win the game if we did not score on the next play.

 - Parallel: I am planning to spend this summer learning to swim, to catch bass, and to play golf.
